Witness and Ministry Committee News

The Witness and Ministry Committee seeks to provide opportunities for members of Grace to be witnesses of God's love by both working in collaboration with and by contributing financial support to faith-based and community-based programs that offer social justice and services to the wider community. We do this in three major ways:

- distributing budgeted mission funds to local organizations;
- facilitating special offerings such as One Great Hour of Sharing;
- participating in the Micro Homes and other collaborative projects.

Committee members attend meetings of local organizations and explore ways that Grace congregation members can participate in projects and events sponsored by these organizations including collection of food goods, backpacks and educational materials and other donations.

Local programs to which we have provided budgeted funding support in previous years include:

<u>Contra Costa Interfaith Coalition</u> acts as a communications link between churches that have volunteers and other resources, and the agencies which provide social services including food, shelter and clothing to the needy in the community.

<u>Hope Solutions</u> provides supportive housing and vital services and is committed to building and renovating homes for unhoused families and individuals.

<u>Interfaith Council of Contra Costa</u> seeks to provide opportunities for interfaith dialogue through educational programs, social events, community service projects, environmental social justice programs, and opportunities for volunteer service in programs.

<u>Interfaith Council of Rossmoor</u> provides a forum for conversations, education, and dialogue for the diverse communities within Rossmoor seeking mutual respect and understanding.

<u>Westminster Woods</u> (Camperships) An outdoor education and recreation program in West Sonoma county with strong Presbyterian roots. It provides a week-long Family Camp in a stress-free environment for families to regroup and enjoy a purpose-filled vacation.

<u>San Francisco Safehouse</u> (Hope Center) Founded by Presbyterian pastor Glenda Hope with multi-faith partners to empower and support women who are experiencing housing instability and sexual exploitation or trafficking.

<u>Habitat for Humanity</u> organizes volunteers to build decent, affordable housing, home ownership counseling, home repairs and affordable community financing for home ownership. Habitat is currently building homes for 42 families at Esperanza Place in Walnut Creek.

<u>Trinity Center</u> located on the campus of St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Walnut Creek. Provides transitional housing and partners with the community to provide shelter, meals, and social services to the homeless, including homeless youth.

The Witness and Ministry Committee invites you to attend our April meeting and to consider becoming a member of our committee. We are seeking guidance as we consider continuation of former funding recipients and to explore new opportunities for support and service. We meet the second Sunday of each month at 11:30 am in the Church library. We hope to see you at our next meeting which will not be held on Easter Sunday, and will be posted in the coming weeks.


