Dear Grace Church Family,

What a beautiful Easter Sunday celebration we had last month! The morning was sunny and warm, the new Easter banners brightened the Sanctuary along with more than 100 people, and the music was inspiring.

These weeks after Easter bring us to the ancient season called "Eastertide," the 50-day period before Pentecost that gives us time and space to contemplate and digest the implications of the resurrection of Jesus.

A quote from Sister Joan Chittister captures the captures the essence of this season: "It's at the tomb that we discover things about ourselves. *Easter it is not so much about the resurrection of Jesus as it is about our own.* Unfortunately, we so often miss it. Jesus, you see, is already gone from one tomb. The only question now is whether or not we are willing to abandon our own. Are we willing leave the old trappings behind and live in the light of the Jesus, the Christ, whom the religious establishment persecuted and politicians condemned?"

Abandoning our tombs and comfortable trappings is *not* an easy task. Leaving behind old habits and familiar practices may be one of the most difficult demands of discipleship. And yet, the resurrection of Jesus is an invitation to do just that. It's a summons to live beyond our limited human expectations that are shattered at the empty tomb. *Jesus, you see, is already gone from one tomb. The only question now is this: are you are willing to abandon your own?* 

As we move into Eastertide, I want to highlight some of the activities and ministries here at Grace:

The Grace Church Monthly Concert series, which ran from September to April, was a wonderful success. The music ranged from classical to hymns and Christmas carols and the many musicians and vocalist were spectacular. A big "thank you" to our Music Director, Jumi Kim, for her immense effort in planning and organizing the concerts.

The Grace Cooperative Preschool children joined us in worship on Sunday, April 23 and shared three joyful songs. The Preschool has been part of Grace for more than 50 years and continues to provide an exceptional service to the community. Please keep the Preschool, its staff, teacher, parents, and children in your prayers.

The Wednesday Bible Study has been a weekly gathering of faithful members and friends who enjoy reading and discussing the scripture passage that is the basis for the upcoming sermon. They are a lively and inquisitive group who help to bring the Bible to life with their keen observations and comments. Please join us, via Zoom on in person, if you are interested. No special "Bible knowledge" is required!

Progress on the Micro Homes Village planned for the Grace parking lot continues. The building plans and other permits have been submitted to the city of Walnut Creek. The next steps are working out the details of the lease and other agreements with Hope Solutions.

Finally, the Session is considering the future of the Earth Care Ministry. There is a meeting on Sunday, April 30 to gauge interest in "resurrecting" the committee. If you are interested and were not able to attend the meeting, please let me or the Church Office know.



- 4. A Game of Fear written by Caroline and (her son) Charles Todd. Their crime stories are set during WWI. They have two series in print featuring Scotland Yard Inspector Ian Rutledge a WWI survivor who suffered from shell shock and Bess Crawford, a battlefield nurse who served in France.
