

Along with other notables were Walnut Creek Mayor, Cindy Silva and Supervisor Candace Andersen. The village of six microhomes to house homeless seniors is in the final approval stages. A construction date has not yet been set.

Grace Promotes Peace in Palestine and Israel Through Our Giving by Meg Keeley

Each year, the Witness & Ministry Committee of Grace provides information about the recipients of our regularly budgeted gifts to the community and the world. It is especially meaningful in these times to know that our gifts are reaching out into the troubled Holy Lands. One of the organizations that we help to support through our gifts is the Pilgrims of Ibillin, which supports multiple organizations, activities, and initiatives to help bring peace and reconciliation to the Holy Land. These schools educate 3,000 (currently enrolled) children from all ethnic and religious backgrounds including Christian, Jewish, Muslim and Druze heritage in the ways of peace, reconciliation, respect, and justice. Pilgrims of Ibillin has also developed partnerships with schools and organizations in the West Bank, Gaza, and elsewhere in Israel to support additional projects working for a just peace for all in Palestine and Israel. Pilgrimages offer visits to many of these partner organizations.
